Cinnabar Presents "The Crucible"

Fueled by the injustice of the McCarthy Hearings of the 1950s, Arthur Miller's American classic gives us an artist's view of the Salem Witch Trials of 1692, in which 19 people were hung and one man pressed to death, convicted of the felony of witchcraft. In examining this story of innocent girls driven by fear and fueled by their superior's rigid beliefs and lust for power, Miller also shows us the other side of human nature – where truth, love and honesty prevail even in the worst of circumstances. Cin-

nabar's teen actors bring to life Miller's passionately written reminder of how quick we can be to judge those who deviate from the norm and what happens when we allow ourselves to be swayed by the crowd.

"The Crucible" is being presented by Cinnabar's Young Rep teen acting ensemble. These actors, ages 12 to 18, have stepped up to the challenge of this great American classic, bringing their boundless passion, energy, and training to Cinnabar's stage. They have an incredible story to tell.

7:30 PM evening performances will be held on February 26 and 27 and March 5 and 6. A 2 PM matinee will be presented on March 7. Cinnabar Theater is at 3333 Petaluma Blvd. North in Petaluma. Tickets are \$15 for general admission and \$10 for children under 18. Teen Night, March 5, students under 18 pay just \$8. Due to adult content, this play is recommended for ages 12 and up.

From February 18 through 28, Sonoma State University's Department of Theatre Arts and Dance will present "Company", with music and lyrics by Stephen Sondheim and book by George Furth.

Set in a vibrant, chaotic, sexy Manhattan, "Company" takes place on committed bachelor Bobby's 35th birthday. Through a series of hilarious vignettes and reminiscences featuring his best friends and his past loves, Bobby examines why he hasn't been able to sustain a committed relationship and weighs the pros and cons.
